Report from the March and May Parish Council Meetings

## Notes from the Parish Council Meeting

Parish Council meetings are open to All and the Councillors look forward to welcoming you.

There is always an opportunity to have your say about anything that is of concern or that you would like the Council to act upon. Meetings are currently taking place in the Conference room at the Thursford Collection.

#### Election of Chair for 2025-26

Sherri Eckworth was re-elected as Chair for the coming year. Gary Pointer continues as Vice-Chair.

#### **Highways Matters**

The Council discussed concerns expressed by residents about the speed of vehicles travelling through the village. Options for additional signage will be discussed with Highways and the Museum. The cost and practicality of the flashing SAM2 Speed sign will be considered if Parish Partnership funding becomes available later this year.

#### **Tyre Bundling Plant in Barney**

The Council continue to monitor the plant and liaise with officials at North Norfolk District Council & Norfolk County Council.

A retrospective planning application is expected in the near future.

#### **Defibrillator Update & Training**

A new Defibrillator has been purchased and installed in the Telephone Box. Councillors would like to express their thanks to all who fund-raised and donated to the machine.

It is hoped that Defibrillator training will take place in the Autumn.

### **Financial and Governance Matters**

Annual Accounts and Internal Audit for the 2024 – 25 Financial Year were reviewed and Approved. The period of Public Rights will take place from 9<sup>th</sup> June until 18<sup>th</sup> July.

A grant of £400 was Approved for SAV to help with costs.

#### **Cemetery Matters**

A review has taken place of the Cemetery Rules and Regulations and the fees, comparing them with those in the local area. These will all now be displayed at the Cemetery on a Noticeboard.

Following the recent appearance of a large amount of dog waste in the cemetery, we also request that any dogs visiting the cemetery are kept on a lead and any waste is removed.

## Dog Waste in Thursford

Unfortunately, with the better weather this problem only gets worse. The Parish Council pay for a bin where dog waste can be deposited and it is emptied every second week. We have the following plea:

## To the dog owners who don't clean up after their pet.



Please help keep our village clean and safe for everyone, and always 'bag & bin' your dog's poo.

Sadly there is an increase in dog fouling in and around the Village.

Dog fouling – whether loose or bagged – is offensive, disgusting and a potential health hazard; being unaware that your dog has fouled or not having a suitable bag is not a reasonable excuse.

# *Practice yoga by bending down and picking up your dog's poo, and pop the bag in the dog waste bin situated on the Village Green; or in your own rubbish bin.*

Many local Landowners permit the public to walk on their land, there is a risk this access will be withdrawn if dog fouling continues.

Please always 'bag & bin' your dog's poo.
