Members' and Friends' Hints & Tips and tales from the Almanacs

<u>Deciduous Trees and Shrubs</u> – Once in their fully dormant state these can be moved to a new spot in the garden.

<u>Pruning</u> – The perfect time to prune many shrubs and trees such as wisteria, roses, grape vines and many fruit trees to encourage fruit production and to maintain an open structure (except stone fruit trees, eg cherries and plums which should be pruned in the summer). However be aware and leave some berries and rosehips for birds and mammals as the harsher weather arrives.

<u>Outdoor pots</u> – Group pots left outdoors over the winter together to help protect them from the harshest weather and stand them on brick or pot feet to help protect them from frost; further protection can be gained if they are placed near to a wall.

<u>Wildlife in the Garden</u> - Leave a pile of logs, twigs, leaves and other natural debris in a corner for sheltering over-wintering creatures such as toads and hedgehogs. If possible, allow small tunnels under fences for them to forage further afield.
